

Music Guild Hears Grinnell Prize Winners

Barbara Phillips Garryle and Robert S. Shulman, winners of the 1953 Grinnell Operatic and Piano Scholarship awards will appear at Cranbrook House, Bloomfield Hills, on Tuesday evening under the auspices of the Cranbrook Music Guild.

Following its custom of encouraging talented young artists, the Music Guild offers the winners of the Grinnell competitions a place on its program each year.

MRS. GARYPHE is a graduate of Wayne State University and has studied on scholarship at Curtis Institute of Music. She is currently studying under a teaching fellowship for her masters degree at the University of Michigan.

In addition to appearances with the WSU and U-M orchestras, she has sung with the Michigan Opera Company and in opera workshop under the direction of Valter Poole. She will sing works by Respighi, Wolf, Debussy and Gilea, and will be accompanied by Miss Margaret Johnson, a graduate student at the U-M.

IN ADDITION to the Grinnell Award, Shulman received the 1953 Mozartium Foundation Scholarship for study in Salzburg, Austria.

A pupil of Mischa Kottler, he has been a frequent soloist with the Detroit area orchestras and has appeared twice with the Detroit Symphony. Chamber music and composing are other facets of his musical interests.

He will play the Chopin Sonata No. 3 in B minor, a Mozart Sonata in F major and Ondine by Ravel.

Guest teacher for the day's session was Mrs. Norma Taylor of Detroit.

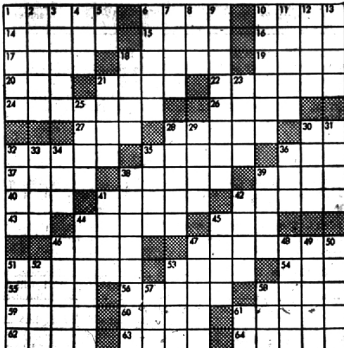

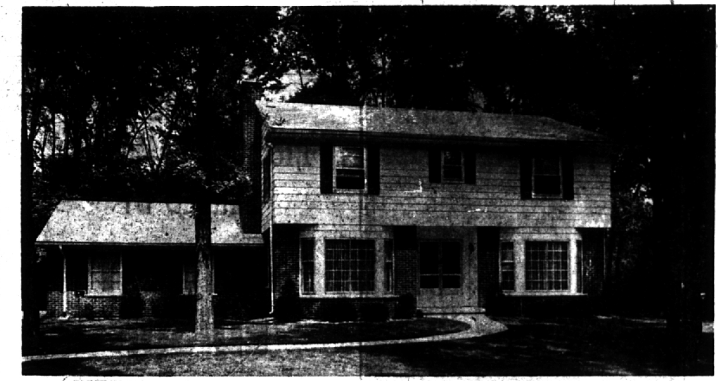

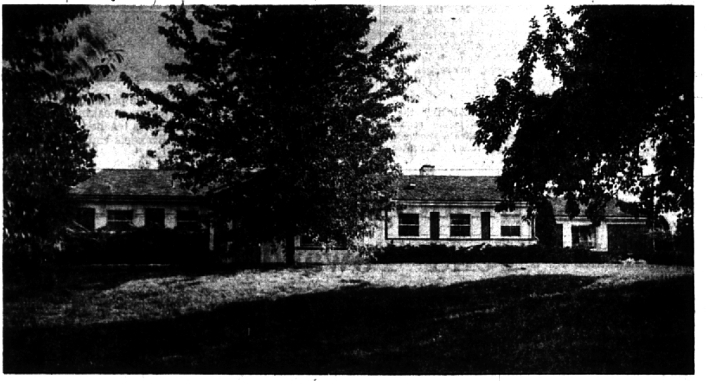
