The woods can only be as safe as the hunter makes them. One careless, drunk hunter endangers the lives of his companions as well as his own. A bottle doesn't belong in the woods.

Neither does a careless hunter. Young boys are interested in their guns. Show them the correct handling, loading and unloading. Impress upon them the killing power of a rife or shotgin.

There is always room for improvement in safety and a conscious, alert hunter helps his sport as well as himself.

YOUNG hunters, taught correctly, become responsible sportsmen. They learn the real joy of glimpsing a flash of a whitetail in the distance, the cackle of a rooster and the cry of a passing flock of honkers. They come out of the woods and marshes as experienced sportsmen, not as senseless, hunting daualities.

During deer season, heed these common-sense rules of gun safety: (1) Be alert for other hunters; (2) Don't surprise other hunters in the woods; (3) Let your hunting partners know where you'll be and stick to the plan; (4) Don't sit on the opposite side of well-traveled runwarz: (5) Be sure befree your sheaf
