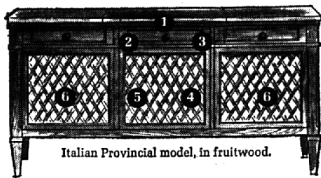

ment, bar associations and social agencies to eliminate racial discrimination," he said.
"I feel the greatest impact of these so-called 'marches' was made by the Washington march and feel there is little point to this march in Birmingham."
"On the other hand, if this is what the clergymen want to do, they have a clear right to do so and I would fight to maintain that right for them even though I did not participate," he said.

COMMISSIONER RALPH MAIN said he would not take part in the festival, either.
"I never take part in any type of parade," Main said. "I also think this is a bad time to have it and I don't feel it will do any good," he said.
Commissioner David F. Breck said he would take part in the festival.
"All residents of this area are invited and I intend to participate," Breck said.

"AS THE PROCESSION is intended as an act of witness primarily of local people of their concern for human rights, I consider it my duty to stand up and be counted among those who believe in truly equal rights for all Americans."
"I'm particularly attracted to these means of expressing my interest because the procession stems from the efforts of responsible residents of our community rather than from uninvited outside groups," Breck said.

COMMISSIONERS WILLIAM E. Roberts and Charles W. Renfrew were both out of town and unavailable for comment.
The freedom festival committee has called a press conference for 2 p.m. Tuesday, Dec. 3, at Our Lady Queen of Martyrs Catholic Church, 32400 Pierce, Beverly Hills, to announce final plans for the festival.
A spokesman for the committee said he was not sure whether the Detroit chapter of the NAACP and Urban League would be invited to take part.
He said the Pontiac groups had been invited because they "seeded groups" than Detroit.

THE FESTIVAL COMMITTEE has received word that both Gov. George Romney and Congr. William S. Broomfield will not be able to take part in the procession or the program at The Community House.
An invitation has been sent to Mrs. Lenore Romney but the committee has as yet received no reply from her.
Abraham Ulmer, chairman of the Housing Committee of the Detroit NAACP and an organizer of the demonstrations in the metropolitan area last summer, said his group had not been contacted by the committee.

HE SAID any Detroit participation would have to be approved by the NAACP board. Ulmer did indicate, however, that he felt the Detroit chapter would take part if invited.
Francis Korneyak, executive director of the Detroit Urban League, was out of town and unavailable for comment.

rates in the seven school districts which cover parts of the city.
Most of the city's residential property owners are in the Troy School District and will pay a total rate of \$38.63 per \$1,000.

BLOOMFIELD Hills School District property owners in Troy will pay a total rate of \$36.85 with \$29.80 going for schools; and Birmingham, \$39.09, with \$32.04 for schools.
In the area served by Birmingham schools, property owners will pay \$59.72 per \$1,000, with \$48.92 for schools, \$9.58 for county government and \$1.12 for special education.
