 voted to allow the structures as necessary buildings.
 Chapman, who was not opposed to the structures, abstained from voting.
 If the board of appeals maintains its present position, it will mean that all tree houses and playhouses in the township will have to be approved by the appeal board. They will also have to receive building permits from the township building department.
 Neighbors who appeared to protest the structures opposed them because of unsightliness and because both the tree house and the play house are located in subdivisions whose deed restrictions prohibit accessory buildings.
