# Residents Assail Contractor For Continual Dirt, Noise

BEVERLY HILLS—A sign was the symbol of dissatisfaction among the residents of Lincolnshire on 13 Mile Road west of Lakeshore over the week end as they protested against continual traffic, filthy roads plus houses and children which refuse to stay clean.

At Monday's council meeting the group showed up in force to ask the council's help in getting the contractor, William J. Pulte, to keep the roads cleaner and to protest the lifting of their sign by a representative from Pulte's office, Mr. and Mrs. Paul Chennault, Mr. and Mrs. William J. Scarborough, Mr. and Mrs. Bart Mangini and Robert Swanson, residents of

Lincolnshire Road and Banbury Court, completed by the council that "one rights as citizens are being overlooked by this man."

THEY REFERRED to their allegation that Pulte has not cleaned up the streets as directed by the council and that they are deluged with dust and mud from the construction of his houses. None of the residents there bought their houses from Pulte.

They further said that Joseph Baranska, vice president of sales in the Pulte organization, pulled up and broke a sign which they had posted asking people not to use their entrance to see the model houses. Baranska, according to the group, took the sign away on his truck.

The sign stated "due to the filthy conditions of the roads, we ask that you use the west entrance to view future homes." It went on to say that the wives have to clean

the houses every day and cannot keep the children clean passing through the dust area.

PEOPLE COMING to look at the new houses politely turned around and went in the other way, the group said. Then Baranska took the sign and the residents went to the police station on 13 Mile Road, west of Southfield, and tried to have Baranska arrested for stealing their property.

They were told that since it was Sunday they would have to go to Royal Oak to issue the complaint. The police confiscated the sign from Baranska and returned it to the owners after the council meeting Monday. Mrs. Scarborough had painted and put up the sign.
