**First Baptist Service on TV**

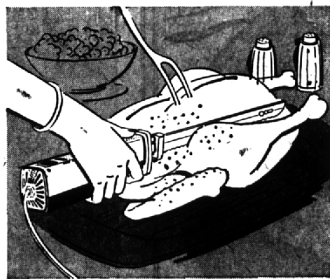

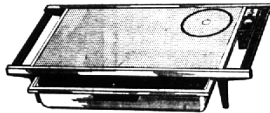

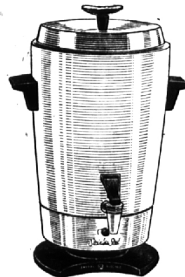
