## Republicans Appoint Clark Twp. Director

Laurence Clark has been appointed township director for the Republican Party in West Bloomfield Township. The announcement was made by Vernon M. Flatman who has assumed her new duties as Oakland County Hospital Chairman.

CLARK, on the engineering staff of General Motors, started his activities with the GOP in 1962. Living in Birmingham at the time, his activities were centered around his duties as a block worker. He has been precinct captain and delegate in West Bloomfield Township for the last two years and has also been active in study and advisory committees in the Third District. Clark lives with his wife Jean at 2367 Acorn Court.
