**DOWN TO EARTH**  
**To Burn or Not to Burn**  
**—That Is the Question**

Every Fall most of us have the happy faculty of forgetting what a job it is to rake the leaves and dispose of them. For many years I used to think it was sacrilegious to burn leaves. You have heard the old saying: "the leaves from one tree are worth \$5 to you as compost."

After raking the leaves from over 30 three trees it is easy to forget all mottos and slogans and just get rid of the whole mountain of leaves.

Take your thumb from the end and the hose will siphon the water out of the pool.

**WHEN YOU** observe your raked lawn, does it remind you that you have not given it the prescribed fall feeding of fertilizer? Grass really has the edge on us humans because as it has perpetual youth. The other part of the leaf is mowed off and the new leaf grows up from the ground—in contrast to most plants. Therefore, the grass plants need constant nutrition to be renewed. The formula on the fertilizer package 10-6-4 is good for this purpose.

**JUST SAW** a new product on the market. It looks like a huge, white Christmas bell of styrofoam and it is hollow on the inside. You place this bell-shaped accessory over your pruned rose plant instead of heeling it up with soil for winter protection, the polystyrene acts as insulation against the elements.

According to the research on the idea, roses protected in this way came through the severe weather of last winter better in contrast to a test plot where soil was used for protection.

**MANY OF YOU** have water pools either for swimming or lilies. Here is an easy way to empty a pool. Attach your hose to the faucet putting the other end in the pool to be emptied. Turn on the water until the hose is full, then turn off the faucet and unattach the hose, keeping it upright so it will remain full of water.

While keeping one end in the pool, place the other end (formerly attached to the faucet) so it is lower than the water in the pool.
