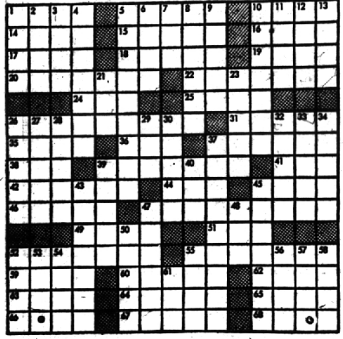

## You Will Be In Stitches At Lecture

A lecture with slides on "Creative Stitchery" will be given by Doris Ann Smith at the Bloomfield Art Association at 8:30 p.m. Friday.

Miss Smith, an assistant professor, teaches design at Eastern Michigan University and plans to show two groups of slides, the first work done by students and the second work by the late Quinn Tyler, who was the recipient of the Lydia Winston prize in the 1957 Craftsmen Exhibition. Actual examples of this year's work in stitchery will also be presented.

STITCHERY has always played an important role in fabric design. Even before cloth was invented men probably used sewing to fasten hides together.

Most weaving techniques produced widths of cloths that required several pieces to be stitched together for garment manufacture. This led quite naturally to decorative embellishment.

Each culture and each period has produced individual stitchery techniques. Some motifs and pattern arrangements have become traditional for many parts of the world.

There are hundreds of basic stitches and their variations. In addition to being used to decorate clothing and other useful items, stitchery has also been used to make monumental works of art.

MISS SMITH received her BA and MA in fine arts from the University of Michigan.

She is represented in the Detroit Institute of Arts with a water color "Annual Exhibition" which was selected from the 1956 Michigan Artists Exhibition.

The public is invited to this program for a nominal charge.

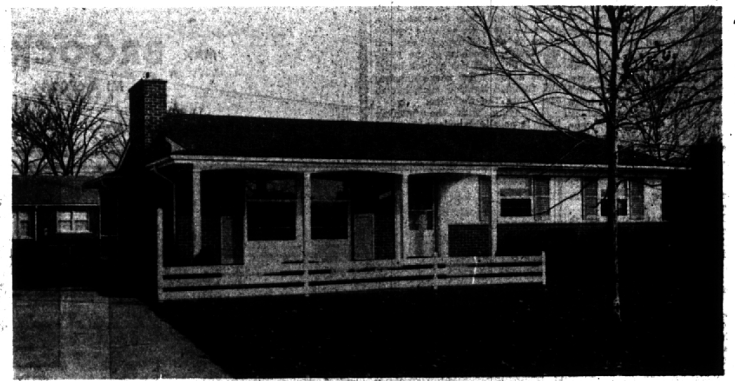

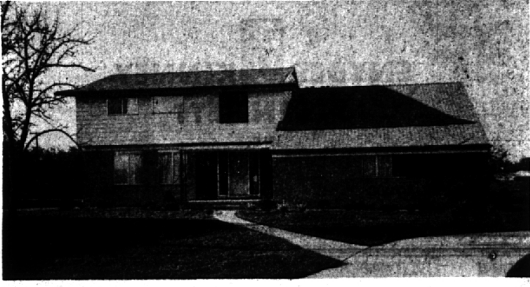

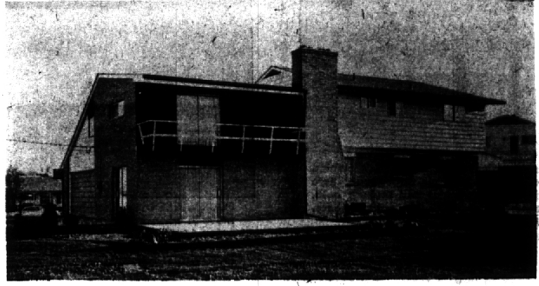
