

Construction Plans Accepted by Church

Emmanuel United Church of Christ, Royal Oak, has approved the construction of new facilities to be erected on Normandy Road just west of Woodward Avenue. The construction contract, in the amount of \$224,691, awarded to the Arthur O. Mich Co. James B. Morison is the architect. Roy E. Lausman is the pastor of the church. Richard E. Kimball is chairman of the Building Committee.

The church purchased the property in northern Royal Oak, on Marshall Frederick, of Birmingham early in 1953. The sanctuary will parallel Normandy Road facing Woodward Avenue. The building will be of colonial design with the steeple towering nearly 90 feet above the ground. Stone pillars will stand at the entrance to the sanctuary. Immediately inside the front door will be a large narthex, screened from the nave, which will seat 300 worshippers.

The CHANCEL will be divided with the altar, the back wall and will provide space for a choir of 30 members. From an "L" running north of the front of the sanctuary, there will be the offices for the secretary and pastor, rest rooms and some classrooms for the church school. One wing will be extended at a later date to provide additional facilities for the educational program of the church and also to provide for a parlor and library.
