Fischer Completes Basic Training

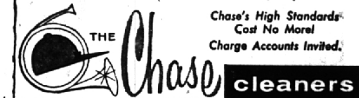

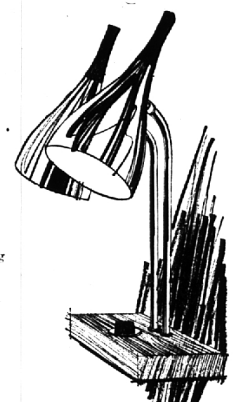
