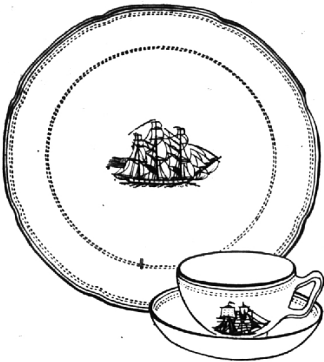


Protective Group Elects Campbell

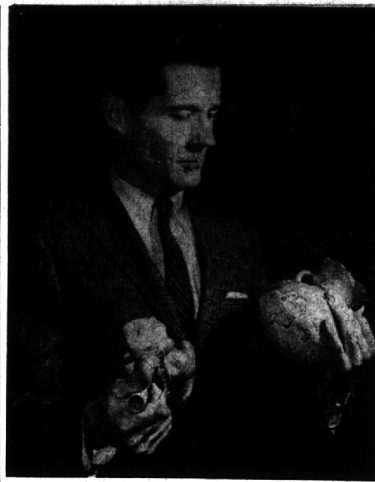

Ecuador Mission Beckons Doctor

Thanksgiving to most Birmingham-area residents normally meant the traditional turkey dinner, family reunions and a day off from the everyday work routine.

To Dr. Robert K. Nixon, however, Thanksgiving signified the temporary end of harvesting the fruits of his profession to planting the seed of knowledge and hope to others less fortunate.

This week end he will be one of many American doctors flying to South America to board the famed hospital ship, the S. S. HOPE, for a mercy-medical mission in Ecuador.

Dr. Nixon will leave his wife Patricia, and two daughters, Carrie, 7, and Eve, 2, at their home at 602 Lakeside, Birmingham, for a two-month special duty aboard the 250-bed "floating hospital."

DR. NIXON'S special forte in this mission is internal medicine, but his 14-hour day will include everything from teaching new procedures to local medical students and nurses to instructing natives in health habits.

Anticipating caring for local residents, Dr. Nixon has been taking Spanish lessons at Seaholm High School.

Vocally proud of her husband, Mrs. Nixon has encouraged him in this journey even though he will be gone during the Christmas holidays.

"I don't need him half as much as they do," she said.

DR. NIXON had originally planned to join Medico, which collapsed when its director, Dr. Tom Dooley, died. Last summer he served his first volunteer stint on the S. S. HOPE when it moored at Peru.

"He thought it was just a marvelous experience," Mrs. Nixon said. "The ship was greeted with shouts of 'Yankee, go home' when it docked, but 2½ months later 50,000 people came to see them off."

Unstable South American politics seem to be the balm of the

volunteers, according to Mrs. Nixon.

"Instead of packing his little black bag, I almost feel like filling an attache case," she said.

Dr. Nixon will take time off from his staff duties at Ford Hospital for the volunteer mission.

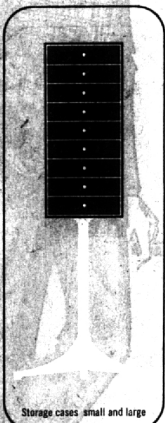

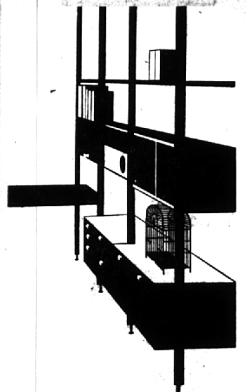
