p.m., and was en route back to his plane within 30 minutes. The reason for the quick departure, Mr. Johnson said, was due to the death of one of his dearest friends. He did not say who.

PRESIDENT Johnson made his first visit to Michigan, in recent years, Nov. 14, 1961, during a Two-day Democratic White House Regional Conference.

He was also in Detroit March 2, 1963, when he spoke at the annual Jefferson-Jackson Day dinner in the Light Guard Armory, plugging for party unity and victory in Michigan's April 1 elections.
