Oakland Schools Builds Headsets

Visitors to Oakland Schools after Dec. 10 should be warned. Those children in earphones aren't ham radio operators.

They are using "listening posts" to get extra instruction or special facts from sound tapes.

Dr. Harry T. Hahn, Director of Instruction of Oakland Schools, has scheduled a class on Tuesday to teach teachers and principals how to build headsets that plug directly into a tape recorder or record player.

MISS MARGARET Scott, audio-visual instructor at Pontiac City Schools, is the original designer of the classroom listening post. Easily assembled with inexpensive materials, the devices are used extensively in Pontiac Schools for individual and small group instruction.
