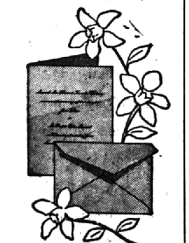
On the afternoon of Sunday, Dec. 29, one hundred young people will begin their outing. Tobogganing and skating, campfires and cookouts will be the main attractions for all until luncheon of the following day when junior and senior high schoolers will depart from the group to ski at Summit or Alpine ski areas until the following evening. The younger children will remain at Camp Ohlyean under supervision.

THERE ARE winterized cabins for sleeping and two large recreation halls where the New Year's Eve party will be held. All campers are insured and a registered nurse will be on the premises. For every seven children, there will be a college age supervisor.

The camp will be under the direction of Mr. Chet McElmore, program secretary, of the Birmingham YMCA, and Mr. Dick Moran, who is a teacher at Burnum Junior High School.

The fee is \$20 per person, however, the skier's fees may be slightly higher, depending upon how much rental equipment is needed. Registration deadline is Dec. 18, and a small deposit will receive a place.

If needed, the Y has limited scholarship money which can be applied to the winter camp fee.

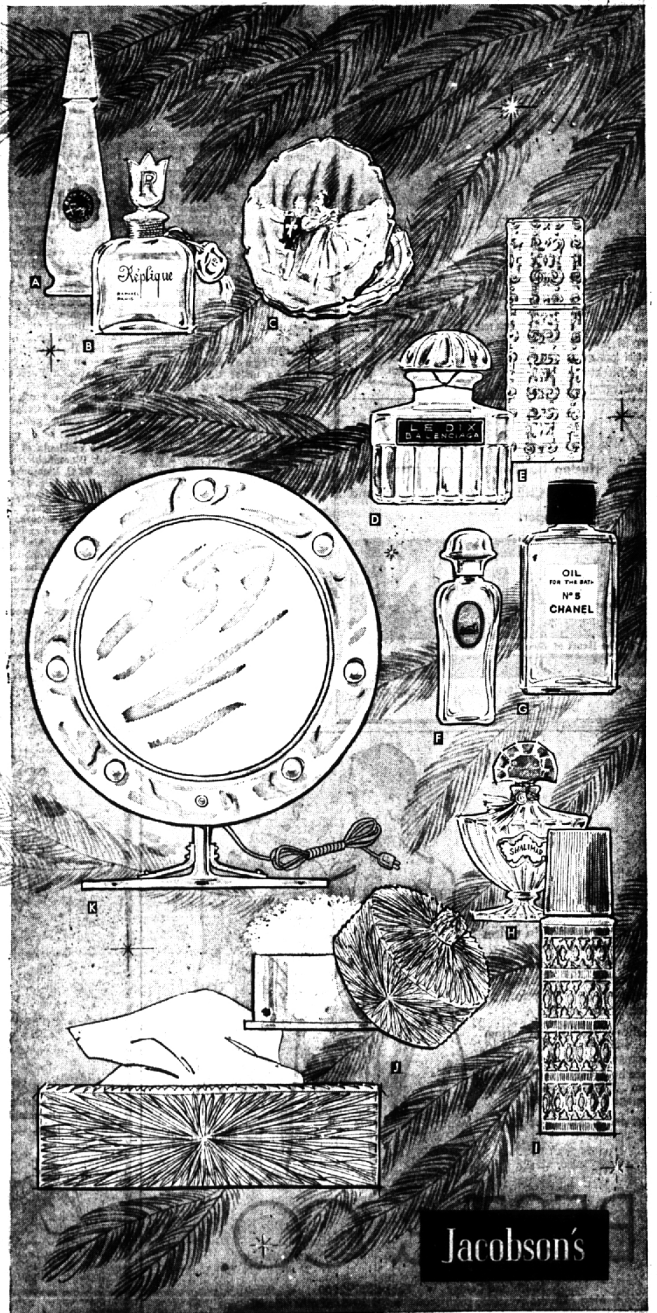
