

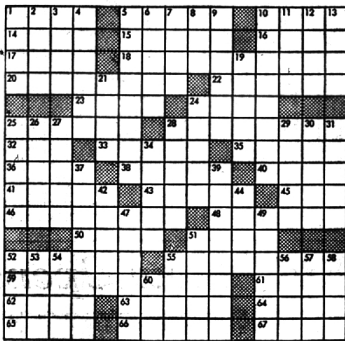

PUZZLE NO. 786

After seeing the name of Ralph Tyson appear in my own column as a winner so often, I decided to get a game with him and find out why he is a winner. This information I did receive, and today's hand explains the reason.

The hand had various results. Some East and West pairs played it at four clubs and actually made the bid. Some North and South pairs arrived at a four heart contract and were defeated, and again some pairs sacrificed at five clubs and received a good board.

Opening lead: K ♠

As I have already stated, I did want to see how good Ralph was, and that is the only excuse I can give for placing him in this five-spade contract. He ruffed the opening lead of the king of clubs and played the king of trump.

When West won this trick and played back the nine of hearts, Ralph decided that he had one line of play to make this contract. East must have both light kings, and he must make a reverse dummy play. With these conclusions, Ralph now led another trump that was won in the closed hand and returned a club for a second club ruff.

HE NOW LED the Jack of Diamonds and overtook it with the queen and played the third round of clubs that he again ruffed. Now

he returned the four of diamonds and played the ten which held.

He then took out the remaining trump and collected his diamonds and gave up a heart trick to make this unusual contract.

All I need is partners like him, and I can bid any way I like.

Renaissance Music Planned

Six soloists of the Sestetto Italiana Luca Marenzio will present an evening of Renaissance musical entertainment at 8:30 p.m. Wednesday in the Detroit Institute of Arts auditorium.

Seated around a table in Renaissance style, this group performs a varied repertoire ranging from the harmonic comedies of Bancheri to the madrigals of Monteverdi.

THE CONDUCTOR and artistic director is basso Piero Cavalli, who founded the ensemble in 1951. He gives the tempo, the cues and a rolling bass line, all at the same time.

He is joined by sopranos Liliana Rossi and Margherita Baker, counter-tenor Carlo Tosti, tenor Guido Baldi and baritone Giacomo Carmi.

The Sestetto has performed in the music centers of Europe and is a frequent visitor to the leading international festivals. Their European recordings have won several Grand Prix du Disque.

They made their debut American tour last year.

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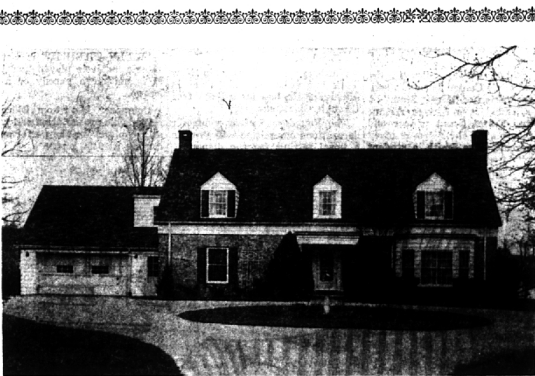
Two Serve On Music Committee

The council's music committee is under the chairmanship of Kurtz Myers, head of the music and drama department at the Detroit Public Library.



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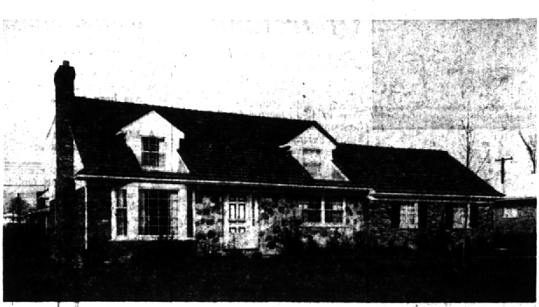
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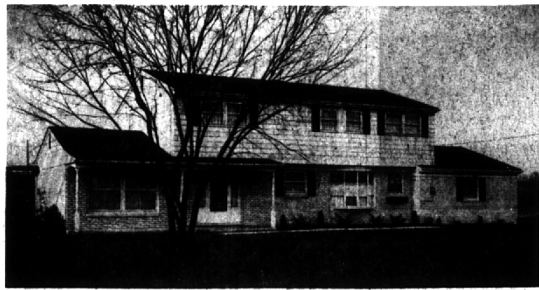
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
