If your recipient is a space fan, he will like "Exploring Earth and Space" by Margaret O. Hyde (McGraw Hill), which covers everything from atomic energy to Telsitar 1 and II.

For girls, good choices are Rand McNally's "Stormy" by Marguerite Henry, the story of Misty's baby; "A Spy in Old Detroit" by Anne Emery, an authentic drama with a local setting; and "Mollie Garfield in the White House" by Ruth Feis, a picture of family life based on anecdotes and diaries of the author's grandmother.

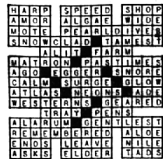

Teen-age romances, historical fiction, science, history and political books can be chosen with the assurance that they will be appreciated. Undoubtedly one of the most popular books this Christmas will be John F. Kennedy's "Profiles in Courage," adapted for the young readers (Harpers).

In the field of girls' fiction, any one of Mary Stolz' books (Harpers) such as "Who Wants Me on Monday," or "One Summer's Secret" by Dea De Jong (McKay) or "Sister of the Bride" by Beverly Cleary (Morrow) will be accepted with thanks.

BOYS WILL LIKE "You and Your Brain" by Clark Millikan (Harper); "The Woodrow Wilson Story" by Catherine O. Pearce (Crowell); "The Plainsmen" by Jack Schaefer (Houghton Mifflin); "The Congress" by Gerald Johnson (Morrow); "Pilot Down, Presumed Dead" by Marjorie Pfeiffer (Harper); "Strangers in Africa" by Russell Davis (McGraw-Hill); "Growing Up in Israel" by Desider Holmiser (Viking); and "This Hallowed Ground" (Doubleday), Bruce Catton's great history of the Civil War, adapted for young adults.

The list is endless, the selection wide and it all adds up to a Happy Christmas for both giver and receiver when the present is a thoughtfully-selected book.

Lately, I have been wandering around town casting nasty looks at bare walls and noting lively, colorful walls worth smiling at via Potpourri.

A BIG POTPOURRI grin goes to hair stylist Gerald David for using the work of Birmingham-area artists.

My favorite sculptor, Betty Gonn, created a glistening glass mural which Gerald David uses as a partition. He has hung Carolyn Hall (and she's one of my favorite artists, too) on his walls and added sculptures by Malcolm Moran and Don Ruby.

Dr. D. R. Scholes uses his hobby to add beauty to his Birmingham office walls. He makes life interesting by clicking his Leica wherever there's beauty or action. He blows up tiny 35-millimeter negatives into striking 16-by-20-inch prints. You couldn't find a speck of grain in them if you used the microscope in the office where they hang.

You never know what eye-pleaser may be hanging on the waiting room walls of Dr. Douglas Chandler. He collects art and fills his waiting patients' view with well-chosen paintings by Marin, Kemnitz and others. He starts a new office art exhibition occasionally by replacing a painting in the office with one from home.

DR. RALPH FOX and Dr. William Cutler have sparked up their office walls with Duty prints.

The work of a Michigan artist who is a member of the family graces the walls of Leon's Parisian Hair Dresser salon. The artist is Berta Leone, wife of Wayne State University Theatre Director Leonard Leone and sister of Leon de St. Nicolas.

Her paintings add a handsome touch to entrance room walls.

The girls under the hair dryers at Bernard's Hair Stylists can keep awake by studying a handsome still life in brilliant water colors by Bloomfield's Joyce Brown.

BERNARD'S HAS recently turned one waiting room wall into a regular art gallery, filled almost from floor to ceiling with paintings. Most of them are from the collection of Msgr. Edward Hickey of Detroit and will be replaced with others every few months.

All of them are intriguing the eyes of visitors to the salon. After I finish a campaign to encourage more good paintings on walls, I'm going to start one to put good paintings on the ceiling over every hospital bed.

ANYONE WHO HEARS the composer discuss a concert before it begins should appreciate the music more. And that's what the University Center for Adult Education—WSU, U-M and EMU—had in mind when they scheduled "Meet the Composers" at 8:30 p.m. Tuesday in the Engineering Society of Detroit auditorium.

Before the performance of works by Harold Laudenslager, 16083 Buckingham, and Clark Eastham of Royal Oak, the two leading Detroit-area composers will talk about their compositions and answer questions. Laudenslager is a violinist with the Detroit Symphony.

Water Color Society To See Photo Program

"Beginning Digressions Using Photography" will be the subject of a slide presentation by Walter Hamady at 8:15 p.m. Friday at the McGregor Memorial Conference Center, Wayne State University. Sponsored by the Michigan Water Color Society for its members and guests, the lecture will deal with photography as a creative stimulus for artists.

More than 125 experimental 35mm color slides will be shown and discussed. Subjects include compositions abstracted from the figure, landscape and still life.
