Buck Fever

Michigan's 1963 deer season is now over and the Army of close to one million hunters has returned to its offices and other jobs.

The season started with early predictions forecasting a record take of approximately 125,000 whitetails, but wet weather held the total down.

Still, all in all, 1963 was a good year for bucks. It is possible that Michigan deer hunters bagged their third highest total on record, a number in excess of 100,000.

LAST SEASON'S take home kill by firearm deer hunters approached 96,000. Checking stations reported a general improvement in the herd's physical condition throughout this season, and although the official count is not yet known, the kill should be quite high.

The closing days of the season at least proved one thing: There were still deer available, since many hunters reported seeing several herds at a distance.

Charles D. Plank, president of The Silverwolf, took several members of the hunting department up to The Silverwolf Ranch in Alcona County.

Jim Olsen, Al Lamoureux, Ed Fitzgerald, Les Abbott and Jack Gumbetter, along with their hunts, accounted for six of the 11 bucks taken at the ranch.

THE GROUP also bagged a Michigan wolf in prime condition, and the animal, with its silver fur coat, will be mounted and displayed in the store.

This Deer Family Found the Answer

Each deer season a large number of hunters use Michigan's state parks for their campsites. At Higgin Lake on opening day this year they were joined by a ten-point buck, a doe and a fawn that selected a resting place just inside the park entrance.

Park manager Tom Gregg reported the deer spent the day there apparently at ease in the knowledge of the park's security. Now and then the buck would raise his head as a car of hunters drove by, but other than that, they showed no signs of concern.
