To Be Wed

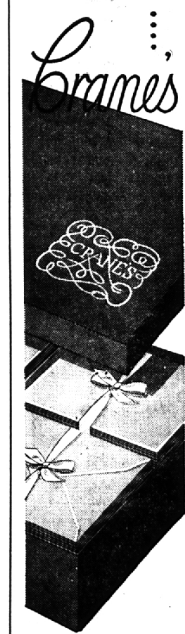
