Last week end Mrs. Bigelow entertained house guests at her home on North Adams Road.

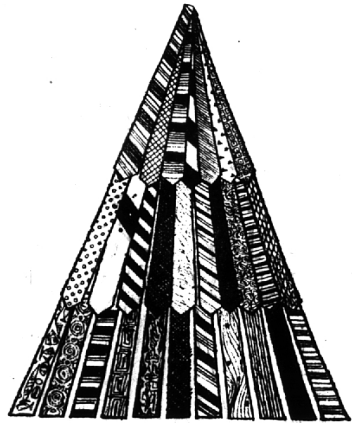
