

1964 Fishing Licenses Out

Michigan sportsmen will be able to buy 1964 fishing licenses and trout stamps at local dealers this week, the Conservation Department announces.

The 1964 licenses and stamps, now being mailed with copies of the state's fish law digest, will be available from Dec. 1, 1963, through the end of next year. This year's licenses and stamps remain good through Dec. 31, 1963.

MICHIGAN'S fishing fees will be unchanged in 1964: \$2 for annual residence license; \$5 for annual nonresident license; \$4 for 15-day non-resident license; and \$2 for a trout stamp.

Stamps will again be required to take rainbow and brown trout during the special Dec. 1-Feb. 29 season when these fish are open to hook and line action through the ice at nearly 250 lakes designated by the Department.



A Hunting Delicacy

Rabbits which are dressed out right after they have been shot make for some of the best eating at the family table. Correct dressing and cleaning help to make the dinner a delicacy. Field-dressing starts by making a cut at the breastbone and continuing down between the back legs. After removing the entrails, the rabbit can easily be cleaned by raising the skin on the back and cutting it with a knife or shears. The skin can then be pulled in opposite directions. Cut off each leg just above the last joint and snip off the head after pulling the skin to the neck. Cut the carcass as shown above and wash thoroughly in cold water. Then cover each piece with salt water in a bowl and let it stand overnight.

Forum Debates City Influences On Suburbs

What is the effect of metropolitan Detroit, its growth or its deterioration, on suburbs? This was the question posed to more than 1000 tri-county community leaders at the day-long seminar on "Our Metropolitan Community—Defining Our Goals."

Goals Forum was founded last year by the Engineering Society, Inter-County supervisors, leaders from business, industry, labor, arts, education and civic affairs. Their aim was to define and set goals to strengthen and improve the metropolitan area, then project them via people-to-people participation in the tri-county area.

PHYSICAL GOALS forum considered current land uses and the orderly metropolitan development based upon a comprehensive, long-range plan.

Economic goals forum decided that a thriving community depended on a favorable business climate for the well-being of all citizens, their jobs and financial stability. It was determined that a closer contact between business and community would add to this.

Government goals forum dealt with getting the most service for the least tax dollar, with direct voter representation.

Socio-Cultural Forum should provide a rich, open individual life offering freedom of religion, education, arts, recreation, health and welfare, according to participants.

Committees are now being set up for the Open Conference scheduled for May, 1964, when national experts will speak to citizens of the city and suburbs.
