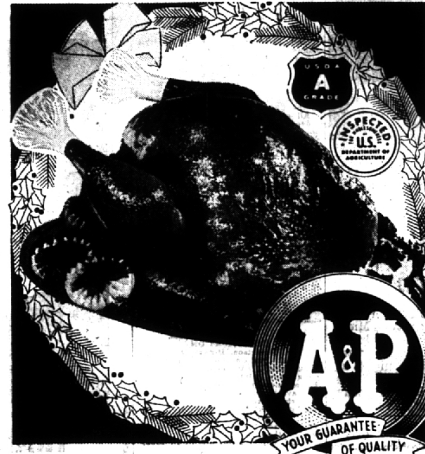
Michigan Publication Seeks Name

Michigan's newest historical publication needs a name.
Published bimonthly by the Historical Society of Michigan, the first booklet merely carries the name HSM Bulletin, awaiting imaginative suggestions from society members and the public at large. The executive committee of the society will choose a permanent name for the publication by Jan. 15, 1964.
The format of the new publication is intended to keep those interested in their Michigan heritage informed of Michigan's historical present as well as its past.

A FEATURE article in the first issue of December, 1963, tells the story of young James Strang destined to become "King James," leader of a group of Mormons on Michigan's Beaver Island in the mid 19th century.

Features on Michigan's historical present include programs and plans of the state and local historical agencies affiliated with the Historical Society of Michigan.
Michigan winners of the American Association for State and Local History awards are also announced in this first issue.
