Car Dealer's Wheel Stealer Gets 30 Days

Gary L. Kasko, 19, of 3793 Lincoln, Bloomfield Township, has been sentenced to 30 days in the Oakland County Jail and placed on two years' probation for taking auto tires and wheels from a Birmingham car dealer.

Kasko was convicted of taking six automobile tires and wheels from Patterson Chevrolet on July 31. He was sentenced Tuesday before Circuit Judge Stanton Donato.

The youth is also currently on probation on a Federal charge of selling false identification cards to area teens.

HE WAS arrested by Birmingham police and FBI agents last June for selling the false IDs to more than 50 persons, mostly teenagers, living in the Birmingham area.

Birmingham, Police Lt. Merlin Holquist said more than 1,000 blank Selective Service cards were seized when Kasko was arrested.

New Golf Course Proposed Tribute To Mr. Kennedy

Edwin P. Dowd, 558 Larchlea, Birmingham, has asked city commissioners to consider naming the new golf course at Lincoln and Cranbrook roads after the late President John F. Kennedy.

"With the shock of the tragic loss of our esteemed President still upon us, nevertheless it seems fitting that a suitable permanent memorial to his memory be established in our city," Dowd said in a letter to the commission.

He said in searching for a tribute to the President it occurred to him that the latest major project to be undertaken in the city was the construction of the golf course.

SEVERAL WEEKS ago city commissioners authorized Mayor William H. Burgum to appoint a committee to find a suitable memorial to dedicate in honor of Mr. Kennedy.

No action was taken on Dowd's letter.

VILLAGE OF BEVERLY HILLS

ORDINANCE NO. 74

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE NO. 4 KNOWN AS THE VILLAGE OF BEVERLY HILLS TRAFFIC ORDINANCE.

The Village of Beverly Hills Ordains:

Section 1.01. That Ordinance No. 4, known as the Village of Beverly Hills Traffic Ordinance, be and the same hereby is amended by the addition of a subsection reading as follows:

Section 94. It shall be unlawful to drive any vehicle over and across any curb as a means of obtaining ingress or egress to any street, road or alley within the Village.

Section 2.01. This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency Ordinance which is immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety and shall become effective immediately upon publication.

Made and passed by the Village Council of the Village of Beverly, Michigan, on the 16th day of December, 1963.
