

Southfield Trims Waterford, '80-66

Southfield scored an impressive 22 points in a well-balanced Blue Jay attack with Friday, spoiling Waterford's debut, 80-66.

The Blue Jays put together a 38-point second quarter when they went into a press formation and all but ended Waterford's hopes. The defensive maneuver resulted in 28 points in one five-minute stretch.

FORWARD Ray Schaff led a well-balanced Blue Jay attack with 22 points. Harry Glass hit for 16, Dennis Lambhad 11 and Joe Conside and Rick Smigielski each scored 10.

The win was the first of the season for Southfield. The Blue Jays now own a 1-1 record.

according to the Conservation Department.

Department field studies and reports of cooperating hunters indicate that last year's all-time harvest of 118,500 woodcock was eclipsed. The increased kill was tied to a higher fall population of timber doodies, and to unseasonably mild weather which kept the birds in Michigan well beyond their normal time for migrating south.

Ruffed grouse kill fell short of last year's take of nearly 550,000 birds, judging from reports of cooperating sportsmen which reflected some 6,000 hours of hunting.

DEPARTMENT field personnel report that hot weather and dry ground conditions hampered hunting with dogs, and add that the birds show signs of having started their cycle decline.

Michigan fielded more than 2,000,000 nimroda, archers and anglers during the 1963 seasons to hold its place among the nation's leaders in hunting and fishing popularity.

For firearm deer hunters, it was the third best year on record, with an estimated 114,500 whitetails in their take-home kill. Pheasant kill fell to 800,000 ringnecks, largely as a result of the poor nesting season last spring.

MICHIGAN'S RABBIT hunters will have a chance to disprove early speculation that cottontails are down in numbers this year.

A lack of snow since the end of pheasant season hampered rabbit hunters. Those that tried the sport reported that bunnies were not as numerous as last year.

These scattered tales have led some to believe that rabbits are taking a nosedive, much like Michigan ringnecks, which were down 16 per cent this year from last.

WELL, THE SNOW is here now and cottontail enthusiasts will have ample opportunity to discover how plentiful Michigan's bunnies actually are.

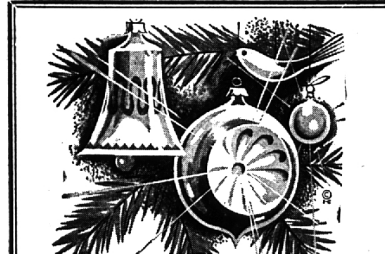
