Dedication Ceremonies Held At St. Thomas More Church

Troy's first Catholic parish, St. Thomas More, was dedicated at 10 a.m. Tuesday, Dec. 17, by Archbishop John F. Dearden of Detroit. Rev. William L. Anderson, 42, is assuming his first pastoring in Troy after serving as assistant pastor in other churches through out the Detroit metropolitan area. Born and raised in Detroit, Rev. Anderson was ordained in 1946. He has served at Precious Blood, Guardian Angel, St. Agatha, St. Francis DeSales and Roseville.

The new parish will consist of approximately 350 families from Holy Name Church and St. Hugo of the Hills in Bloomfield Hills. The new building, which will eventually serve as a school, is located on Adams just north of Wattle. The parish is constructed in contemporary styling, entirely of brick. Future plans call for a complex which will include a rectory, school, church and convent.

Dr. Thomas Author Of Religious Book

Dr. Ernest Thomas, minister of the First Methodist Church, Birmingham, has written a book, "Disciplines of the Spiritual Life." The 10-chapter book is beamed at older youth and young adults in an attempt to deepen their spiritual life. It is published by the Abingdon Press.
