BRIDGE in BIRMINGHAM

Playing with one of my favorite partners, Tom Batton, we received the hand for today. This very interesting hand found many results. Those who played it at three trump, North and South, found themselves with a minus score. Some East and West partners received a part score at hearts, but with the vulnerability being as it was, not many did arrive at this part score.

The Bidding:
EAST WEST SOUTH NORTH

 Opening Lead: A ♠
 When Tom bid three clubs, he not only stopped further bidding by us but also by our opponents. Should they arrive at their best position of three hearts, they would be doubled and go down one for 200 points.

After winning the opening lead of the ace of diamonds, East did continue with his second diamond, and after West won this trick, he failed to find the winning play of the king of spades and shift to a diamond.

Instead, he played the third round of diamonds, which was ruffed high in the closed hand, and after extracting two rounds of clubs, the six of spades was dropped on the high diamond. This gave Tom and I a top board of 130.

THREE HEARTS IS beaten one trick by North opening a spade and getting a spade ruff and a second spade ruff—or if North opens the king of Clubs and South plays the ace and returns a club and North continues a third round of clubs, which South ruffs with the 10. This would give them three trump and two club tricks.
