

## Groves Wins Swim Meet

Falcon swimmers, amassing from a defeat at the hands of Royal Oak Kimball a week ago, turned on the steam against RO Dondoro to win their second dual meet of the season, 63-42.

Groves won eight of the 11 events, losing out to Dondoro's Tom Hunt in the 200-individual medley and 100-backstroke and dropping the diving competition. The Falcon 200-medley relay team won their event in a 1:56.2 clocking, while the 200-freestyle relay squad won in 1:44.1.

DAVE MEAD captured the 50-freestyle and Groves swimmers finished 1-2 in 100-butterfly, 400-freestyle and 100-breaststroke.

just five seconds left, but that was all the time needed as Rice strategy worked to perfection.

Skover put the ball in play by passing to Paul Jagels, who in turn passed upcourt to Terry Finn. The lanky sophomore flipped the ball to senior center Bill Moore and the 6-6" Warrior took a 30-foot jump shot that swished through the basket as the buzzer sounded.

The victory enabled Brother Rice to move into a second place tie with U. of D. Both schools have 3-1 records in league play and trail league-leading Notre Dame (4-0) by one game.

THE WARRIORS, who have now shown that they are a definite title contender in their first year in the powerful Central Catholic Division, will have a chance to move into a first place tie with Notre Dame when they play the leaders next Friday at home.

Rice trailed throughout the contest, but remained within striking distance. The visitors built up an 18-13 first-quarter advantage and then outscored Rice, 15-14, in the second stanza to lead at halftime, 33-27.

The Warriors started their come-

back in the second half and poured in 28 points to U. of D.'s 20 in the final two periods.

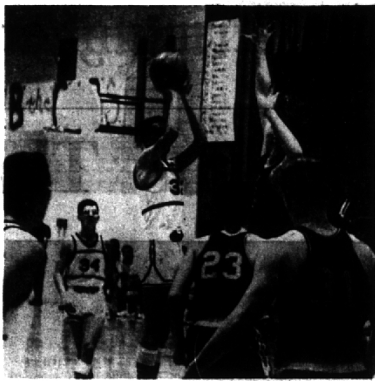
Trailing 43-40 going into the fourth quarter, Brother Rice dribbled away at the lead and finally tied it up. U. of D. tried stalling until the final 11 seconds, but Skover's steal set up the game-winning play.
