

**Two House Fires In S'held Cause \$5,000 Damage**

SOUTHFIELD—A double house fire Saturday afternoon caused about \$4500 damage to one home and about \$500 to a second house, firemen said.

The two homes were under construction and located near the corner of Alhambra and Evergreen. They were owned by Rimbrowd Homes Construction Co., Oak Park.

Firemen said the blaze apparently started from a fire confined to a barrel in the basement which was being used to thaw out earth for laying concrete.

One home, 26 by 24 feet, was totally destroyed. Flames from this fire started a blaze in the second fire destroyed a house, a 45 by 35 foot structure.

**Citizens Tap Six Attorneys Interest in List Judicial Council Race Qualifications**

FRANKLIN—Consisting of geographical area representatives from every corner of the village, the Franklin Citizens Committee is working again this year to stimulate interest for a contest in the March 11 council race.

Called together by last year's chairman, Fritz Geib, the committee elected Ken Bailey as the 1963 chairman. Assisted to serve as representatives of each neighborhood were Mrs. John Donaldson, Paul Settle, Phil Bowers, Richard Ford, Homer Haskeman, David Wirth, Mrs. David Bartleson and Mrs. Dozier.

The committee will seek candidates for office on the ballot in the election. Positions open are three council posts, each for a two-year term. Also open are the offices of clerk, treasurer and assessor, each for one year.

Square Lake Road and in surrounding public easements are included in the project.

The bonds are payable from 10 annual installments with the full faith and credit of the township pledged to meet principal and interest should the installments be made slow in coming in, Kelley said.
