Sidewalk Replacement Plans For 1963 Approved in B'ham

City Commissioners Monday night approved Birmingham's 1963 residential sidewalk replacement program.

William T. Killen, city engineer, said the program would cost the city and property owners a total of \$26,000. It would benefit by about \$26,000.

Three major areas will be included in this year's program, Killen said.

They are:
 An area bounded by Lakeside, Quarton, Woodward and the south side of Oak.
 An area bounded by Maple, Eton, Derby and Coolidge.
 The City's share of the project would amount to \$11,220 and the property owners', \$15,075.

KILLEEN SAID that the extent of the project was determined by the amount of money available for the City's share and that presently there is about \$14,400 available in the sidewalk account.

In describing the areas, Killen said the Lakeside-Quarton project was originally part of the 1962 program but had been dropped because the contract limited the amount of money available for the City's share and that presently there is about \$14,400 available in the sidewalk account.

IN ADDITION to replacing faulty sidewalk in the Maple-Eton project, Killen recommended that new sidewalks be constructed on portions of St. Andrews, Coolidge and Edenborough.
