Mrs. Thomas Richards and Mrs. James Bloomfield were in charge of reservations.

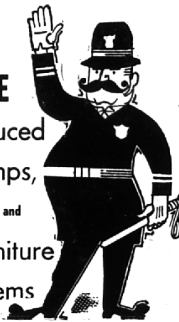
