the sun, which moves eastward along the ecliptic.

- Aphelion:** (Ap HEEEL ee on) The point of an elliptical orbit around the sun which is the farthest point away from the sun. The earth's aphelion is 94,500,000 miles from the sun.
- Albedo:** (Al BEE doe) The percentage of light that is reflected from a body such as the moon.
- Coriolis:** (Core ee AWL iss) This is an accelerating force which acts on all particles which freely move over the earth's surface. It acts at right angles to the direction of motion of the particle, and carries the particle to be deflected to the right in the northern hemisphere, and to the left in the southern hemisphere.
- Hypoxia:** (High POX ee a) Oxygen deficiency in the blood, cells, or tissues in the body or scarcity of oxygen in the air.
- Hyperoxia:** (HIGH per ox ee a) The term used to describe subject living in a pure oxygen environment.

State Map To Be Ready Next Month

The 1963 Official Michigan State Highway Map will be off the press soon.

State Highway Commissioner John C. Mackie said the new map, which has several major improvements, will be ready for distribution by mid-March.

Mackie said hundreds of changes have been made on the map since last year, mainly the result of new freeways that have been opened to traffic. Michigan now has more than 1,000 miles of freeway.

THE MAJOR IMPROVEMENTS on this year's map are larger blow-up maps of Michigan's major cities and larger strip maps of the state's major freeways showing the location of the on-and-off ramp design of each interchange.

The map contains city inset maps of Detroit, Pontiac, Grand Rapids, Flint, Saginaw, Lansing, Jackson, Battle Creek, Kalamazoo, Ann Arbor, Bay City, Muskegon, Midland, Port Huron and Benton Harbor-St. Joseph areas.

Mackie said 600,000 maps will be printed by Gutter Lithographic Co., Milwaukee, Wis.

Copies of the map are available free of cost by writing Maps, State Highway Dept., 732-B Mason Building, Lansing, 26.

Mackie said persons writing for maps now will receive them as soon as they are off the press.
