

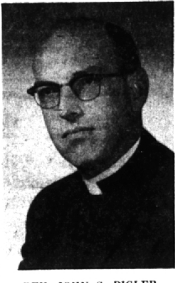
Ordain St. James Deacon To Episcopal Priesthood

Kirk in Hills Performs Bach's Sacred Music

In a rare two-part performance of one of the great works of sacred music, the choir of Kirk in the Hills, Bloomfield Hills, will be joined by orchestra and organ at 4 p. m. this Sunday and on Feb. 24 to perform the "Mass in B Minor" by Johann Sebastian Bach.

Soloists for the performances are Doralee McNelly, soprano, who has just returned to the Kirk from a tour to Russia with the Robert Shaw Chorus; Alice Stenz, contralto; Charles Wingert, tenor; and Duncan Sells, bass.

The orchestra will be composed of area musicians and Philip Steinhaus, organist-choirmaster-cartooner to the Kirk, will conduct.

Bach's masterpiece contains 16 choruses: nine of them for five voices; four for four voices; the "Sanctus" for six; and the "Gloria" for eight. In addition, there are six solo arias and three duets.

The Kyrie and Gloria sections will be sung Sunday. The Credo, Sanctus and Agnus Dei will complete the work on Feb. 24.

Missionary Tells Women's Group About His Work

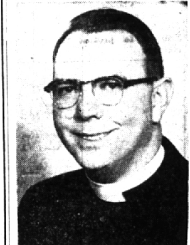
