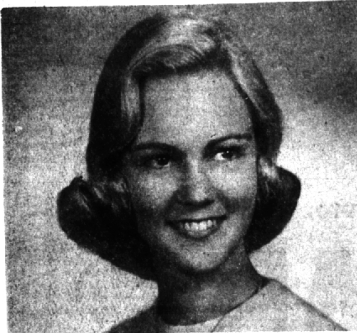


# Brides-Elect

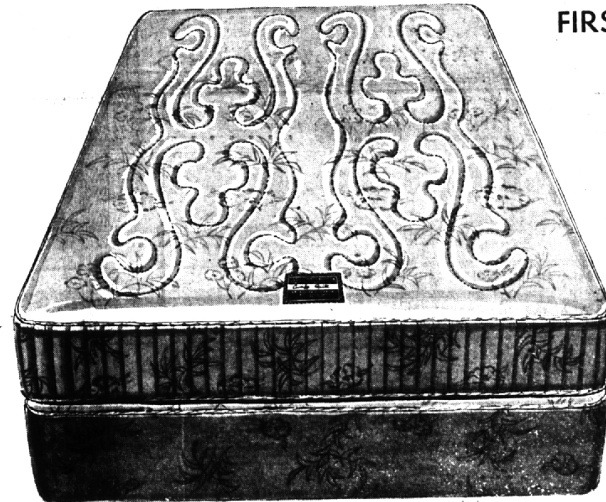

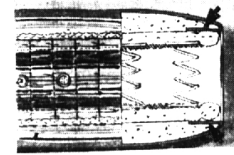
