

### Crittenton Changes Site For New Unit

Approval of a change in the proposed site of the Suburban Unit of Crittenton General Hospital by members of the Campaigns Executive Committee, consisting of residents of the Troy-Utica-Orion-Rochester area, was announced today by Howard L. McGregor, Jr., vice president of Crittenton General Hospital Board of Trustees and chairman of the Suburban Unit Committee.

"The site formerly selected on Auburn Road near John R. was found to present serious sewage and drainage problems," said McGregor. "Were the hospital to be constructed on the original site, a sum in excess of \$210,000 would be required to overcome these obstacles."

WILSON'S \$250,000 home at W. Long Lake Road, Bloomfield Township, and a \$400,000 Louisiana plantation were community property with his wife.

Nearly \$5,500,000 in stocks from a number of corporations and another \$225,000 in municipal and school construction bonds formed the bulk of the estate.
