Products, Achievement Program Entries Open

If your company has developed a product that has meant jobs and an economic boost to the community... If your organization has developed an agricultural product or process that has brought recognition or investment opportunity... If your group has helped create jobs or advanced community or cultural development... In any of these cases, an award and state-wide applause may be forthcoming, provided you act promptly.

"BECAUSE OF the time needed for other judging, it is essential that all entries be received by March 17," Whitfield said that the Agriculture Award of the Year is a new addition to the Michigan Week program. It will be given for either a product or a process, which must have attracted favorable attention or investment to the community. Other requirements are that it have an excellent potential and that it must have originated or been developed in Michigan within the past few years.

THE AWARDS ARE those offered in the Products and Achievement Program of the annual Michigan Week observance scheduled for May 19-25. With the March 1 closing date of the contest only weeks away, a special call for entries has been issued by W. L. Whitfield, Oakland County chairman of the award program and manager of the South Oakland Division of Consumers Power Co.

"All that we need is a letter containing descriptive information," Whitfield said. "It should be sent to me at Box 469, Royal Oak, Mich., as soon as possible. The three major winners will receive their awards at a meeting of the Economic Club of Detroit May 20, and there will be special presentations in their home communities.

Survival Supplies Move Into Fallout Shelters

Survival supplies will be moving from federal warehouses to approved fallout shelters in Michigan, State Police Capt. Richard L. Nicolen, deputy state director of civil defense, reports.

The requisitions are forwarded by county and local civil defense directors to the Defense General Supply Center at Richmond, Va., and in Michigan the supplies will be dispensed from warehouses in

Rossford, Ohio, and LaPorte, Ind., to nearby locations, and at Livonia, Mich., the principal distributing point. Stockpiling at the centers is already underway.

IN ALL, 3,703 fallout shelters have been listed in a state-wide survey, but thus far only 1,164 have been licensed for such use by written agreement with the program owners.

Many of the other properties, with the oral consent of the owners, also have been marked with fallout shelter signs, but only licensed properties are eligible for supplies.

Of the total properties listed, 3,774 have a protective factor of 100 and of these 964 are licensed. An additional 1,029 were listed following an expansion of the program in November and have a protective factor of 40 to 99, the lower standard being designed to save lives in large areas not exposed to the most intense radiation. There are 500 of these properties licensed.

THE LICENSED properties of both types would afford shelter for 570,000 persons, but all of the shelters combined would accommodate 3,150,000, which is less

than half the population of the state.

The supplies are paid for by the federal government and include preserved food and containers for water sufficient for two weeks. Also provided are sanitation kits and medical supplies.

Sent directly to the directors without going through the warehouses are radiological monitoring instruments for the shelters.

Only six counties in the state have no public shelter facilities of any kind. They are Arenac, Oge-
