## BRIDGE



in BIRMINGHAM

The inter-city team of four tournaments is now nearing the half way mark and Birmingham's team, captained by George Alderton III, has not lost a match. This team also won its divisional championship last year. One may say that they are not timid.

Today's hand brought the most unusual results. George's North and South half of the team arrived at a slam, while his East and West half also were the contracting pair, who arrived at a one spade contract and made two.

North and South vulnerable: Dealer is East.

NORTH'S RESPONSE of two no trump was a bit lean, but I do prefer the jump with a minimum. When this is done, the raise of one no trump over a one club bid is the six to nine point raise.

Inasmuch as George's partner was not his usual partner, he felt this North was stronger and knew he didn't need many high cards by his partner to arrive at game or even slam.

West arrived at the best opening lead of the king of diamonds and when East won the ace of trump he, too, returned a diamond. This scared George, but he could afford two diamond ruffs and still pull trump, if he found the king of clubs on side.

WHEN HIS East and West half of the team played this hand, East and South passed and West opened the bid at one diamond and when East over-called one spade he won the contract and played it well to make two spades.

It may be noted that George's team was leading by over 1000 points when this hand came up.

## Two from Area Study in Rome

Crystal Jane Nofz, 19, of 1065 Greentree, and Richard Edward Bassal of 1360 Pilgrim, Birmingham, are attending class at Loyola University's Center of Humanistic Studies in Rome, Italy.

The perceptual development program is built on diagnostic teaching," Miss Lukens said. "By watching these children as they are diagnosed, teachers will have clearer ideas about receptive and expressive language abilities of the children they teach."
