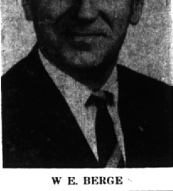
Swedish Capital Flowing To American Gage Affiliates

In a reverse of the trend to American dollars going to promote and Wickham, Detroit factory representative chiefly engaged in contacting the auto industry, of 3006 Oakhill Drive, Birmingham; and affiliate.

Explaining this different approach is W. E. Berge of 191 Concord Dr.ve, Bloomfield Hills, president of the C. E. Johansson Gage Co., Swedish Gage Company of America, located in Dearborn.

HE SAYS, "The Johansson organization today has plants and manufacturing facilities in Sweden, England, France and Germany, as well as in the United States for over 30 years. We have sales and service representatives in 50 countries throughout the world, useful for export purposes. "We are now expanding the American affiliate. Our sales staff alone will be increased 400 per cent, from 20 to 80 people. "Our 1963 allocation request is \$130,000 to facilitate and update the plant capacity—not including expansion costs." AN AUTOMATIC gaging machines expert, Swiss-born Gustav Stadler has been brought over from Europe. He will eventually reside in the Birmingham area where many of the Johansson executives live.

Says President Berge, "From special gages we are diversifying into automatic gaging machines, short-run production on precision, engineered components and parts, custom designed and built services. "We can offer American manufacturers the benefit of development in other European companies." ACCORDING TO Berge, the Johansson Gage Co. will probably be moving to the Birmingham area this year. "We have favorable sights looking down Big Beaver," he explains. "Among the company men who live in this area are Lion Wentworth, in charge of all marketing, promotional and publicity activities in the United States, of 4865
