Resolution On Airport Gets Praise

The Pontiac City Commission received a pat on the back from Birmingham Commissioner William H. Burgum Monday night.

Pontiac governing body sent to Birmingham a copy of a resolution it adopted opposing a proposed airport in the county.

"It is a fine resolution," Burgum commented, "and I wholeheartedly agree with them."

Birmingham passed a resolution last year opposing expenditure of any sums for the development of a major airport at the county-owned site at the Allen Airport north of Pontiac.

THE COUNTY has already spent more than \$367,000 for the purchase of property in that area.

The Pontiac commission went on record as saying that duplication of public service by units of government is extravagant and unwise and should be prevented if possible.

Pontiac officials would like to see the existing facilities at Pontiac Municipal Airport expanded.

Burgum said he thought he would send a personal note to the Pontiac commission congratulating them on their stand.

The commission took no action on the Pontiac resolution.

Juvenile Officer Post in B'ham Goes to Squire

Patrolman Millard Squire has been named Birmingham's new juvenile officer, according to Police Chief Ralph W. Moxley.

Squire, 31, was chosen after a competitive examination of 10 other members of the police department.

A six-year veteran of the Birmingham department, Squire is presently attending the Southeastern Michigan Police Chief's Association and FBI-sponsored school in Ferndale.

Before coming to Birmingham, he worked a short time on the Waterford Township Police Dept. He is a four-year veteran of the U.S. Air Force.

Squire is married and has two children. He is a resident of Pontiac.

Three Residents Take Out Petitions For B'ham Posts

Three more Birmingham residents have taken out nominating petitions to run for office in the April election. Deadline for filing the petitions is 4 p.m. Saturday.

David C. Breck, 928 Clark, and Allen D. Tucker, 612 Woodward, have indicated an interest in the office of city commissioner.

Incumbent James Tobin, 756 Glenhurst, has taken out petitions for a new term on the city's library board.

The petitions must be filed in the clerk's office in the Municipal Building at Martin and Pierce.

Set Hearing For Teen in Sniper Case

BLOOMFIELD TOWNSHIP—A hearing will be held Wednesday in juvenile court to determine whether or not to try Douglas Godfrey for murder as an adult. County Prosecutor George Taylor has entered a petition to try him on this basis.

Pending the hearing the youth, who confessed on Feb. 5 to the sniper-slaying of his mother, Mrs. Mary Godfrey, is being held in the Oakland County Youth Home. Probate Court Judge Donald has agreed to have the boy examined by three psychiatrists, two of them chosen by Godfrey and one appointed by the court.

THEIR REPORTS will be due Wednesday. A clinical psychologist for the Juvenile Court, John McBride, and a juvenile court case worker, Wallace C. Crane, have already given Judge Adams reports on the boy.

Mrs. Godfrey was slain Jan. 25.
