who were registered cast ballots, there was only one contest.  
Three GOP candidates for two trustee nominations were narrowed down to incumbent Robert A. Reid, 1,184 votes; and Robert M. Sinclair, 1,018. Frederick A. Chapman lost a nomination with 875. Otherwise, the township's April candidates will be Homer Case for supervisor; Arno L. Hulet for treasurer; and incumbent Deloris W. Little for clerk.

## ORDINANCE NO. 590

### AMENDMENT TO ZONING ORDINANCE

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION 3.3 OF ORDINANCE NO. 527 OF THE ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF BIRMINGHAM AND THE ZONING MAP, BY ADDITION OF A SECTION TO BE KNOWN AS SECTION 3.3-30.

THE CITY OF BIRMINGHAM ORDAINS:  
Section 1. That Section 3.3 of Article 3 of Ordinance No. 527 be amended by addition of a section to be known as Section 3.3-30, said Section to read as follows:

Section 3.3-30. Property at 707 Knox Street described as follows:  
City of Birmingham, Oakland County, Michigan—Assessor's Plat No. 25—Being a plat of part of 88 1/2 Sec. 25, T 2 N, R 10 E—Part of Lot D 27 described as beginning at the NE corner of Lot 22;  
thence S 2° 04' 30" E 119.21 ft.;  
thence S 87° 54' 50" W 50 ft.;  
thence N 2° 04' 30" W 119.19 ft.;  
thence N 87° 45' E 50 ft. to point of beginning.

shall be changed from its present classification of P-Parking to R-2 Single-Family Residential Zoning District.

Section 2. The Zoning Map attached to Ordinance No. 527 shall be deemed modified to incorporate this change.

Section 3. Ordinance No. 574 of the City of Birmingham, is hereby repealed.  
Ordained by the Commission of the City of Birmingham this 18th day of February, 1963, to be effective upon publication.
