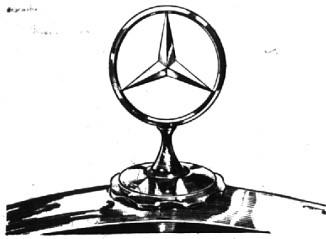

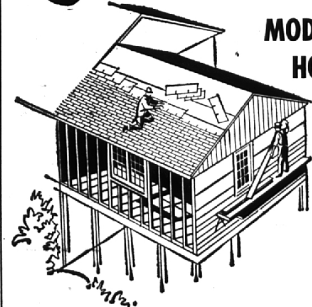

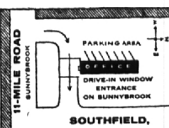

tion of Groves from the Harlan area will seriously hamper after-school activities of their children.

THE PARENTS' also believe that the plan if adopted would limit Harlan youngsters in their social activities. They feel that their children would be "isolated" and many friendships and acquaintances with children from remote areas would be forced upon their youngsters.

An alternate solution to the administration's plan has been offered by the citizens committee. It would allow the Harlan youngsters to continue to attend Derby and Seaholm and would send Westchester and Bloomfield children to the new junior high and to Groves.

THE HARLAN group believes that this plan would "not interrupt the funneling theory of continuity of education espoused by the school administration."

The Harlan PTA Board has sent letters to the members of the school board and the residents of the Harlan attendance area opposing the boundary changes.

The PTA had held off its judgment on the proposed changes until after an explanation by the administration at a special meeting Feb. 7.

THE LETTER stated that "frankly, the PTA Board did not find adequate support for the proposal in this explanation and, after further deliberation wishes to make it known that it is strongly opposed to the re-districting plan."

If the board should adopt the plan offered by the Harlan people it is expected that the Westchester residents would object because of their nearness to Seaholm.
