The first project of the new NHS will be the planning of a workshop with the NHS of Immaculate high school to take place this spring.

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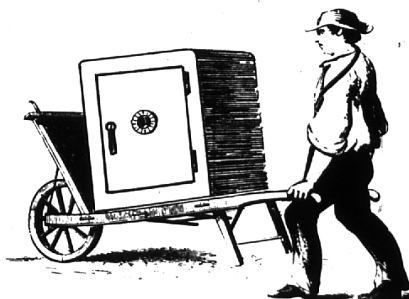
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
