Feb. 23, 1933
The First National Bank of Birmingham was to continue business today on the same 5 percent plan of withdrawals. It adopted following Gov. William A. Cretzschmar's holiday proclamation last week, it was announced in a statement from the Board of Directors yesterday. The Governor's second proclamation issued Tuesday will have no effect on the bank here, the statement said.

Over the strenuous opposition of City Treasurer Robert C. Hargreaves, the Bloomfield Hills Commission last night approved a net operating budget for 1933 of \$32,699. When adopted at a public hearing to be called later, the budget will include estimated expenditures for the first six months of 1934 and will be approximately 50 percent larger.

Further reduction in the salaries of Birmingham school teachers is one of the subjects under consideration today by a committee of the Board of Education appointed last Thursday night to study all aspects of the school financial situation in Michigan, especially as they apply to the local system.

A Tiny Tearoom and How It Grew

Devon Gables restaurant at 1116 W. Long Lake Road on Telegraph, Bloomfield Hills, today has a "boastful 700" seating capacity, according to Laura Turner, who with her husband, H. P. Turner, manages the dining landmark that has grown with the Birmingham-Bloomfield community. The original Devon Gables was a small tearoom seating about 45 people and was started as a promotional venture to stimulate area subdivision sales by the late Harry F. Menard, realtor of Knight-Menard Co. Plans were to use the

tearoom later as a community house, but with the stock-market crash and the end of the subdivision dream, the tearoom closed down. "When the banks closed, we opened," says Mrs. Turner, who explains the Turners started the restaurant in 1933 to serve the then small-community farming area. 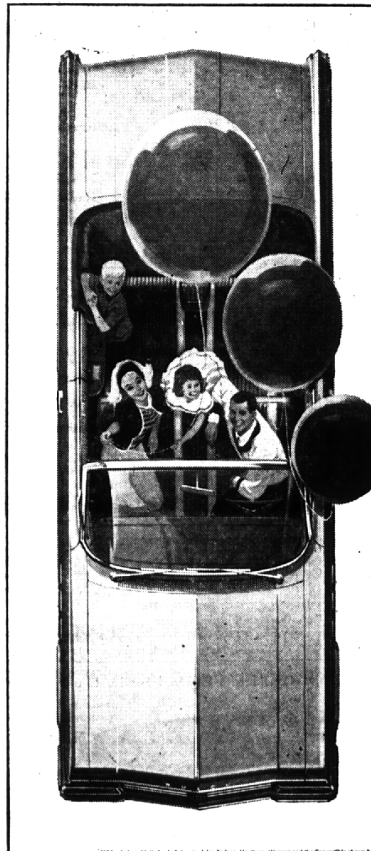
