Jim knew that it was only a matter of what suit the slam will be in and if it is a small slam or grand slam. Here his partner opened vulnerable and he had 20 points. When he found his partner with but one ace, that held him to the small slam, but which suit?
When West doubled the six diamonds, he knew he must be the declarer so that the opening lead would not come from East.
Had West failed to double, chances are that East would not have led the spade. West still had hopes of setting the contract and came up with the club lead.
Jim now found it easy to take five tricks each in the blond suits

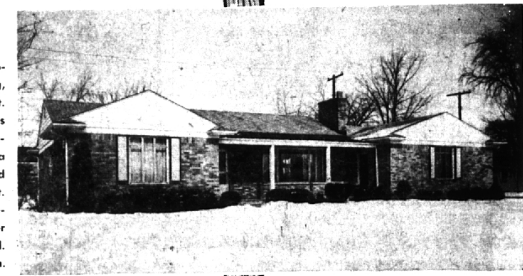
