The colonial charm of Pierce street owes much to the remodeling of the old Edison substation some years ago. The old structure was purchased by J. H. McBride who then had the building jacked up and rebuilt to its present two stories. The finished job was named the Williamsburg Building and is composed of three units. It now houses the Glassford Shop, the Eldon E. Generous Custom Tailor shop and Village Travel Service. The remodeling initiated the colonial note on another of Birmingham's streets leading to the attractive aura of our city today. McBride, who moved from the area 10 years ago, says he "looks upon the building with pride in a job well done... a heritage of my life spent here."

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that in conformity with the Michigan Election Law, the final date for registration in order to vote in the General Election, is Monday, March 4, 1963, at 8:00 o'clock p.m.

TO VOTE AT THIS ELECTION, all persons must be registered, citizens of the United States, 21 years old, who have resided in the State of Michigan six months and in the Township of Bloomfield thirty days prior to April 1, 1963, are eligible

NOTICE IS FÜRTHER GIVEN, that any person who is not already registered upon the registration books of said township may register on or before March 4, 1963, during regular reflice hours. Monday, thru Friday of each week, 9,00 o'cloed a.m. to 5,00 o'cloek p.m., and in addition to the regular office hours, the office of the Township Clerk will be open for the purpose of receiving registrations during the following hours:

SATURDAY, March 2, 1963 from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon. MONDAY: (last day) March 4, 1963 from 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.

TO TRANSFER a registration from one address to another WITHIN THE TOWNSHIP OF BLOOMFIELD, send a signed request to the office of the Township Clark, stating present address, former address, and date of moving to present address.
