A new city office was created Monday evening when city commissioners concurred in the city manager's appointment of C. Leonard Gurn, 38, city planning engineer, as Director of Public Works. This action came as the result of a Hall-Liles, Detroit management consultant firm, recommendation that city operating departments be grouped together under a co-ordinator who would supervise departmental activities.

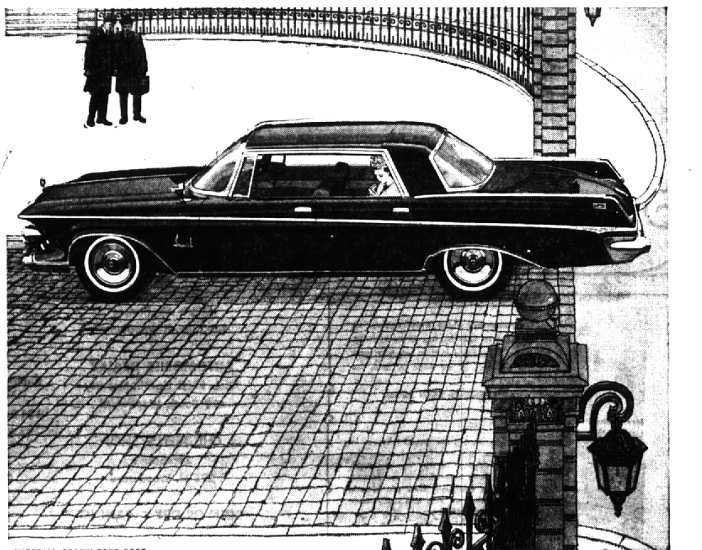
