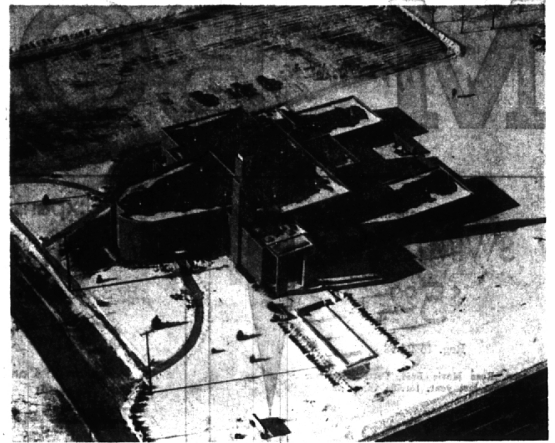
S'field to Begin Civic Center with March Ceremony

SOUTHFIELD.—Groundbreaking ceremonies for the city's \$2 million civic center buildings will be held at 2 p.m. March 24. The announcement was made last week by the Southfield building authority and the city council.

On the 166-acre site will be the new city hall, police building, library and community recreation building. Construction was made possible by two grants from the Federal Works Acceleration program for \$878,000. The city will match this total amount with an issue of revenue bonds. There will be no increase in taxes.

AN OUTGROWTH of efforts of the council, building authority and the civic center development committee, the construction will provide the first new major municipal buildings since erection of the present city hall in 1882.

The over-all civic center program is a 20-year development in three five-year stages.

Serving as a religious, cultural and recreation center for the church, the structure is also used by the Pontiac Ward and periodically by 11 other ward congregations ranging from Toledo, Ohio, to Sarnia, Ont. Gov. George Romney (of Bloomfield Hills) was president of the Detroit Stake and American Motors at the time of the opening.
