### Crittenton Changes Site For Hospital

Approval of a change in the proposed site of the Suburban Unit of Crittenton General Hospital by members of the Campaign Executive Committee, consisting of residents of the Troy-Utica-Orion-Rochester area, was announced today by Howard L. Mc Gregor, Jr., vice president of Crittenton General Hospital Board of Trustees and chairman of the Suburban Unit Committee.

"The site formerly selected on Auburn Road near John II. was found to present serious sewage and drainage problems," said Mc Gregor.

"Where the hospital to be constructed on the original site, a sum in excess of \$210,000 would be required to overcome these obstacles.

### Proposed Raise For Barry, Aide To Be Dropped

A proposal to increase the pay of County Drain Commissioner Daniel W. Barry and his deputy out of South Oakland funds will be dropped, according to the chairman of the supervisor's drain committee.

Mayor David R. Calhoun said that he and Barry agree that it would be a good way to do it although, Calhoun said, he believed it was legally defensible.

The chairman said he will ask others on the committee to seek the raise from county general funds. This would delay any raise for Barry until his present term expires Dec. 31, 1964.

"FOR THIS REASON, and also to insure satisfactory permanent drainage, officials of the Hill-Burton Fund and other agencies interested in the plans for the Suburban Unit indicated the urgency of selecting other land."

McGregor announced that a new location has been selected on Wallingford near Liversonia and commented that the distance between this and the original site is so insignificant that no geographical segment of the community should be inconvenienced by the change.

"We will continue," he said, "to plan facilities advantageous and accessible to all residents of the Troy-Utica-Orion-Rochester area."

SUGHT WAS AN increase of \$2,800 more to bring his pay up to a total of \$17,500. At present his salary from the county is \$15,500. He also gets \$1,200 per year from the Southeastern Oakland County interceptor sewage disposal system.

The plan had been based on Barry's work in overseeing the \$40 million 12-Town-Dequindre interceptor projects.

A number of cities in South Oakland had objected to the raise from the funds of the disposal system. They said his pay was a county responsibility.
