Oakland County would gain three seats in the state house of representatives if an amendment plan designed by GOP lawmakers comes into being. It was offered Thursday as a substitute plan if the proposed new constitution should lose at the polls on April 1.

Ten Republican legislators joined to support the bill which would cut the house down one member, from 110 to 109. It would take away four of Wayne County's 28 seats and one each in the Thumb area, the Upper Peninsula and the northern part of the Lower Peninsula.

The GOP supporters of the bill said it would meet the stipulation of the present constitution which requires reapportionment this year to allow for 1960-61 population changes. Under the new constitution, a special commission would be set up to reapportion the house.

Raymond L. Randels, assistant executive secretary for the MEAG Camp, spoke on the constitution and answered questions before Mrs. Charlotte Richards, National Education Association state director, introduced a resolution calling for the acceptance of the document.

THE COUNCIL has joined with its parent organization, the MEAG, in urging the electorate to accept the new constitution.

In other business, members discussed the MEAG's representative assembly which will be held March 28-30 in Lansing. The issues coming before the assembly—a new constitution, the election of officers, a proposed professional practice act, and adoption of professional priorities—were discussed.
