The second of a series of Family Lenten Potluck Suppers sponsored by the Committee for Our Christian World Mission of the Congregational Church of Birmingham will be held from 6:30 p.m. to 9 p.m. March 14.

The guest speaker for the evening will be Dr. Robert Batchelder of The Detroit Industrial Mission. Dr. Batchelder is an ordained minister and a graduate of Yale University Divinity School.

He earned his degree in the field of social ethics and religion and was pastor of several churches during his period of study.

Following graduation he came to the Detroit Industrial Mission. This is a new field which seeks, in a pioneering way, to relate the Christian religion to the problems of industrialized society.

THE DETROIT Mission was an Episcopal venture which has now become interdenominational with the calling of Dr. Batchelder and two Protestant ministers to their staff and the addition of members of other denominations to the Board of Trustees.

## Unitarians Plan Speech At Potluck

Speaker at the Birmingham Unitarian Church's potluck supper Friday night will be the Rev. Albert Nielsen, formerly an Episcopal minister in Ann Arbor and now associated with the University of Michigan's Center for Conflict Resolution.

He will speak on "Resolving International Conflict—Suggestions on Facts."

The supper is scheduled for 6:45 p.m., and the program, to which the public is invited, will begin at 8 p.m.

After five and a half years as minister of the St. Clair Episcopal Mission in Ann Arbor, Nielsen has joined the Center for Research on Conflict Resolution.

THE CENTER is a pioneering effort toward world peace established at the university in 1969, the result of three years of planning by social scientists at the university with the cooperation of prominent educators and scientists here and abroad.

How the advances in the social sciences can be applied to the problems of war is the concern of the center.

Through the publication of The Journal of Conflict Resolution: A Quarterly for Research Related to War and Peace, church seminars, conferences, research and the specific training of young scholars in the field, the center is devoted to the marshaling of centers in solving international conflicts. Nielson will develop the theme Friday.


