Need More Dogs, Say
Michigan State Police

With the success of the tracking dog
program, the state police are
seeking donors of five more Ger-
man Shepherds to expand the
coverage in the state.

Started as an experiment in
November of 1960, the dog and a
trooper-handler trained at the
St. Louis, Mo., police department
canine school, four more dogs also
were acquired by gift in the fall of
1961 and trained at East Lansing
headquarters.

The first full year of the ex-
panded program, 1962, has shown
the value of the dogs for tracking lost
or escaped criminals and articles of
evidence. The program, how-
ever, has been handicapped by the
long distances it has been some-
times necessary to transport the
dogs to the scene, the tracks be-
coming cold or being destroyed in
the meantime.

DOGS ARE NOW stationed at
East Lansing, Ionia, Jackson,
Houghton Lake and Marquette,
each with a trooper-handler who
carries on normal assignments
when the dogs are not in use.

One result of the program has
been that in a number of instances
it has not been necessary to call
out as many troopers on a search,

Position on
Main Issue

BEVERLY HILLS—"Mr. Chair-
man, can I vote against my own
motion?"

This question was asked Monday
by President Pro Tem Hugh G.
Allerton, Jr., of President Marvin
B. Cline.

Allerton had just made a motion
that permission be granted David
Robinson to use asbestos cement
pipe water mains in Subdivision 3
of Beverly Hills Estates, on Ever-
green just north of 13 Mile, sub-
ject to the approval of the water
department.

Philip Hampton, office manager
for Johnson and Anderson, village
engineers, recommended against the
asbestos cement pipe and in favor
of the usual cast iron pipe.

ALLERTON MADE the motion
to bring the matter to the floor
for discussion, but was not inclined
to vote for it over the village en-
gineer's objections.

Since Village Attorney Thomas
J. Dillon was not present to answer
Allerton's question, and no one
else seemed to know, he withdrew
the motion.

The matter was put on the agenda
for the next meeting.

In other business, the matter of
increasing the water service con-
nection fee due to increased cost
of water meters was also placed
on the next meeting's agenda.

JOHNSON AND Anderson were
also authorized to prepare plans,
specifications and estimate of costs
for a 12-inch water main on 13
Mile road from the end of the
Village Green sub to a point at
the western end of the property
owned by the Birmingham School
Board for the new Berkshire Com-
munity Junior High School on
Bellevue Trail and 13 Mile road.

They were also authorized to
prepare the same for a 16 inch
water main from the end of the
Standard Oil Station on 13 Mile
road east to the center of Southfield
road.
